Report on Activities as SRC/NUGS Women's Commissioner for the 2024/2025 First Semester

As the Women's Commissioner for the Students' Representative Council (SRC) and National Union of Ghana Students (NUGS), I am pleased to report on the activities I have undertaken to promote the welfare and empowerment of women in our university community. Throughout the first semester of the 2024/2025 academic year, I have been dedicated to organizing and participating in various initiatives that support and uplift women students.

One of the highlights of my tenure was the organization of the She Power Conference, which took place on February 21, 2025. This celebration sparked meaningful discussions and provided valuable insights into the progress of women's rights in our country.

Furthermore, I worked closely with the Gender Mainstreaming Directorate and POS Foundation to organize a workshop on the prevention of sexual harassment on campus, held on March 4, 2025. This initiative aimed to create a safe and supportive environment for all students, particularly women. By addressing this critical issue, we can ensure that our university community is a place where everyone feels valued and respected.
